Date: **19 June**

Time: 18h00

The Kalahari Surfers describe their music as eclectic electro world-dub sound. Don't miss them on stage on 19 June at 6pm. Following hot on their heels at 7.15pm are Johnny B and da Realistics with their unique 'caribojazz'. And remember to catch all three games live on the special FIFA 74sqm screen.

Hitting the stage at 6pm today with traditional Cape Malay goema, African rhythms, funk and salsa is Robbie Jansen & Friends. Next to light up the stage are the beatbox style tunes of Dave Ferguson, setting the scene for kick-off between Brazil and Cote D'Ivoire at 8.30pm, live on the FIFA 74sqm screen.

Led by choir master Phumi Tsweu the Gugulethu based Fezeka High School Choir will show us exactly why they were invited to perform at some of the most prestigious organisations in United Kingdom.
