## SAFETY IN YOUR CAR

- Have your keys ready when going to your car.
- Always lock your doors. Park in well-lit areas at night.
- Keep enough distance between you and the car in front, in case you need to change lanes or drive away in a hurry.
- Don't give lifts to strangers.
- Look around before entering your driveway. Never open your window when approached by a stranger.
- If you think you're being followed, drive to the nearest police station.
- Keep your valuables out of sight.
- After you've parked your car, make sure it is properly locked so that you don't become a victim to thieves who use "remote jamming" devices.

## SAFETY WHEN OUT AND ABOUT



Don't walk in deserted or dark areas. Stay in a group and on lit paths.



Keep your possessions on you and in sight.



Don't leave your valuables on restaurant tables.



Don't carry large sums of money and avoid counting it in the open.



The use of headphones may distract you from what's happening around you.



Use a map to get around.



Tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return.



You do not need a permit to walk in any of our streets.



Use accredited taxis and cabs.



Don't leave drinks unattended.

## SAFETY AT THE ATMS



Only use secure ATMs in public areas, like a shopping centre.



Do not allow anyone to take you to or help you at an ATM for any reason.

## WILDLIFE

Wild animals are attracted to food. If approached, maintain a safe distance and move away. Avoid displaying food and keep vehicle windows and doors closed when they are nearby and never feed them. Do not approach, touch, feed or interact with them. Always keep your pets on a leash and prevent them from interacting with them. Seek immediate medical attention if scratched or bitten.

Check with Cape Town Tourism if you are unsure if an online listing or website is legitimate.
